

**BYLAW 11-019
OF
LAC LA BICHE COUNTY**

A BYLAW OF LAC LA BICHE COUNTY IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING THE LAC LA BICHE COUNTY LAND USE PLANNING TASK FORCE.

WHEREAS, the Municipal Government Act empowers a Council to pass a bylaw to establish a Council Committee and other bodies; and


WHEREAS, the Council of Lac La Biche County has determined that it is in the best interest of the municipality to pass such a bylaw;

NOW THEREFORE, under the authority and pursuant to the provisions of the said Municipal Government Act, and by virtue of all other enabling powers, the Council of Lac La Biche County, duly assembled, enacts as follows:

1. The Lac La Biche County Land Use Planning Task Force is hereby established and for which function shall be in accordance with Schedule "A" which is attached to and forming part of this Bylaw.
2. The Lac La Biche County Land Use Planning Task Force shall be a Committee consisting of six members at large, three Council members, one non-voting Lac La Biche County administration representative, and one external consultant/facilitator.
3. The non-voting Lac La Biche County administration representatives shall provide administrative services to the Land Use Planning Task Force.
4. A Councillor shall serve as Chairman of the Lac La Biche County Land Use Planning Task Force.
5. The term of appointment shall be until Council adopts a new Municipal Development Plan.
6. The selection of members at large will be based on land use planning interest and consist of persons who are employed and/or involved in the following: business; resource industry; land development;; environment; urban development; and agriculture.
7. If an application is not received from the selected area represented, Council may appoint a suitable resident from the area, upon Consultation and agreement from the selected resident, to serve as an appointed member.
8. County Council, notwithstanding Clause 5, in its sole discretion, may, by resolution, cancel the appointment of any member to the Task Force at any time during the term.
9. This Bylaw shall come into effect upon passing of the third reading.



'SCHEDULE A'

The proposed objectives of the Land Use Planning Task Force will examine the County of its entirety. The proposed objectives of the Lac La Biche County Land Use Planning Task Force include:

- 1) Review the former Lakeland County and Town of Lac La Biche Municipal Development Plans, which are currently adopted by Lac La Biche County and to derive a draft Lac La Biche County Municipal Development Plan which will meet current legislative requirements and be a living document which will guide the Planning/Development activities of the County over the next 10 to 20 year period.
- 2) To undertake an aggressive consultation process, with area stakeholders including area residents, businesses, industry, services sectors, developers, land owners, and representatives of various resource sectors of Lac La Biche County, to provide input into the frame work of Land Use Planning and the current drafting of a Municipal Development Plan, which can be reviewed and adopted by Council.
- 3) Review the demographic data and socio-economic impacts of growth in the determination of current and future land use.
- 4) Review all Recreation, Transportation, Environmental, Agricultural, Natural Resources, Watershed plans studies and their relationships to current and future land use patterns and projected growth.
- 5) Review proposed Lower Athabasca Regional Plan (LARP) documents for the area and the relationship and integration of the region's policies to assimilate into the Draft Municipal Development Plan.
- 6) Provide a draft communication plan for Council's review in regards to the overall project schedule, stakeholder input, public interaction, and final presentation and implementation to all area stakeholders.
